2.9.1 Learning outcomes for unnamed CertHE and DipHE

An unnamed CertHE/DipHE is awarded when a student has achieved the requisite number of credits at levels 4 and 5 and no named exit awarded was established when the target bachelor's degree was approved. They are awards at a different level to the target award, and therefore the course learning outcomes, which are set at level 6, are not an appropriate point of reference in determining the learning outcomes the student has achieved.
