

University of Bedfordshire Careers and Employability Service Graduate Statement of Service

This document is designed to provide an overview of the ongoing careers information, advice and guidance support services available to graduates from the Careers and Employability Service.

1.0 Context

The Careers and Employability Service provide ongoing access to a range of support services for graduates for as long as they need during and after the completion of their course of study.

Graduates [within the first 3 years following the end of their course] have access to the full range of information, advice, guidance and support services offered by the Careers and Employability Service (see table).

Graduates who completed their degree more than 3 years ago have access to a range of Careers and Employability Services (see table 1).

2.0 Eligibility

Our Graduate Support Services are appropriate for and open to graduates who were awarded an undergraduate [Inc. Foundation Degree], postgraduate (research or taught) qualification or completed an apprenticeship from the University of Bedfordshire [or partner colleges] and studied at a campus [or partner college] within the United Kingdom.

Graduates who are undertaking their studies at international partner colleges / campuses outside of the UK have access to resources and information available on our website.

The Careers and Employability Service are unable to provide support to University of Bedfordshire staff (or family members of staff) who do not meet the eligibility criteria outlined above.

The date at which you are awarded your qualification by the University of Bedfordshire will be the date that is used to determine the level of support you are able to access. Where a graduate has previously completed a course (i.e. undergraduate) and has subsequently completed further higher level study (i.e. postgraduate), the chronologically most recent award date for the highest level of study will be used to determine the level of access for that graduate.

If you are attending an online appointment or event and your network connection fails, we will endeavour to ensure you can continue to participate by letting you back into the appointment or event at the earliest possible opportunity

If you fail to attend three consecutive bookable appointments, we reserve the right (at the discretion of the Assistant Director Student Experience / Head of Careers
